I'm checking out an older complaint. Could I get your name and badge number, please, first? This is FBALM from IB Records. I don't have a badge number because I'm a secretary.

Okay. I'm a clerical worker. You can look this up? Yeah.

(1:03 - 1:12)

Okay, I've got... Can you repeat your name? I just want to make sure I have it. L-A-M. Oh, okay.

(1:13 - 1:32)

Lim, right? Yeah, sorry. I-A-B. They were brought over from the CCRB, but the reference number I got was I-A-B reference 2-0-2-3-0-6-8-4-6.

(1:33 - 1:43)

2-0-2-3? Yeah, it's old. It's a 2023 case? Yeah, and they have never responded to it. I got four numbers on that year.

(1:44 - 2:01)

Oh, give me your last name. The name on the complaint is David Patrick... Oh, is this not your complaint? What? Is this your complaint? I put in the complaint with the CCRB, and then they

sent it to I-A-B. Yes.

(2:02 - 2:17)

So I don't know... Correct. I don't know how the internal thing works, but the name on the complaint is David Patrick Gartland, not the person I'm complaining about. Is that your name? That's my name, yes.

David... David Patrick... Gartland. G-A-R-T-L-A-N-D. G-A-R... G-A-R-T... L-A-N-D.

(2:30 - 2:35)

Gartland. G-A-R-T-L-A-N-D. Yes.

(2:36 - 3:36)

Hold on. Hold on a second, okay? Yes. Computer's kind of slow.

Okay, I'm willing to wait. I've waited three years. Yeah, your case is closed.

(4:20 - 4:26)

How's it closed? No one gets a hold of me. I put in the complaint under the penalty of perjury. There's four numbers.

(4:26 - 4:46)

There's three other... Two other numbers. Can you look at those two? It's ridiculous it's closed, because it's factual. The other number, I have 202307340 and 202307398.

(4:50 - 5:11)

And if they closed them, they had to get a con... They were supposed to get a hold of me, right? Yeah, they're supposed to contact you, but... Obviously, they... All right, so do you have a letter showing that they contact me? I'll give you my email address, and you can email me. No, we don't do that. Basically, hold on.

Hold on a second, okay? Okay. Didn't they contact you on January 3rd, 2023? They have never contacted me. I contacted them to find out if they were in use at some point.

If they got them after the CRC said they sent them, I wanted to make sure they were there. And I got the information that they were there. I have the officer's name and everything.

(6:00 - 6:18)

And this is very serious, because this states that there isn't one single officer on the force that has taken a lawful oath of office. And this is very easy to tell. You could just go to your YouTube account and look at NYPD's oath of office, and then go to the Constitution, and you know it's not right.

It's absolutely wrong. And you likely took the same oath, too, as a civilian employee. I do hereby declare is definitely unconstitutional and repugnant to the Constitution.

Without the oath of office, you're not a police officer. And I have evidence that not one cop has taken it since 2007 correctly, at least. Because that's what's on the NYPD website on YouTube, their own channel.

That's what's on there. And I've downloaded every single one of those videos to prove it. Do you understand that this is a threat to the Republic? A direct threat.

I'm giving you evidence of treason on the phone. And you can look up those reports. It's all there.

You have a responsibility under misprison and treason under Title 18. You better find out because anyone... I'll read it to you. I'm telling you the truth.

You don't want to get screwed here. You could end up getting hung. This is treasonous code.

And NYPD has kidnapped me four times without a warrant. This is ridiculous. Misprison and treason.

I'll read it to you right now. Whoever owing allegiance to the United States, having knowledge of, commission of any treason against them, conceals and does not, as soon as may be disclosed, make known that the same to the president or to some judge of the United States or to the governor or some judge or justice of a particular state is guilty of misprison of treason and should be fined under the title or imprisoned not more than seven years or both. And doing nothing makes extended treason.

I'm not trying to scare you. I'm telling you the truth. That's the law.

(9:24 - 9:31)

I just read it to you. Hello? I'm listening. I'm listening.

(9:31 - 9:34)

Okay. So you want to write this down. You can look it up yourself.

Title 18, U.S. Code, Section 2382, misprison of treason. And then I got to go into... This is an insurrection. There's a lot of charges here that are going to be filed.
